**GOVERNMENT'S MOTION FOR REDUCTION OF SENTENCE**

The United States of America, by and through Michael T. Shelby, United States Attorney, and Glenn Cook, Assistant United States Attorney, for the Southern District of Texas, makes the following motion:

1. On June 21, 2002, the defendant was sentenced by this Honorable Court to 37 months in prison, a \$2000.00 fine, 5 years of supervised release and a \$100.00 special assessment for possession with intent to distribute 5 grams or more of cocaine base. The defendant's sentence was reduced at the request of the government at the time of original sentencing pursuant to a 5K1.1 motion. Evidence showed that the defendant assisted his co-defendants in the delivery of approximately 19 grams of cocaine base.
2. The defendant, Roberts, has since met with State officers and Harris County Assistant District Attorney Katherine Cabaniss in relation to a murder


investigation against defendant Daequinjamin Williams. Roberts was able to assist in the investigation and testified in the trial. Defendant Daequinjamin Williams was found guilty of murder in State Court. ADA Cabaniss found Robert's testimony to be honest, truthful and of great assistance to the State in this prosecution. The government considers this assistance to have been substantial.

3. The government recommends that the defendant's sentence be reduced from 37 months to 30 months.

The United States requests this Honorable Court to grant this motion pursuant to Rule 35(b), Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure.
